3. Study and Examination Regulations

On starting your study, you should familiarise yourself with the study and examination regulations relevant to your study course as well as the framework examination regulations of Wismar University. These lay down the framework conditions and regulations for a proper course of study and the general framework of the examination procedures for each degree programme.

You can use the regulations to plan your studies and timetable for the individual semesters.

The framework conditions for examination law for the degree programs are regulated in the framework examination regulations.

4. Examinations

Exam Registration

You have to register for every exam you would like to take over the course of the semester. Registration is subject to a prescribed period of time.

We will announce the registration period in due time by means on our website.

Where do I register for an exam?

Online, of course! – www.lsf.hs-wismar.de / www.hio-wismar.de

With the university currently switching to a new exam management system, not all degree programmes can be found in one system. The home pages of the platforms list those degree programmes that each platform includes.

So, what do I need for this?

Nothing else, other than an Internet connection and a PC of course.

You can use the user ID the university issued you with at the beginning of your study for access.

And if I need help?

We will send you more information on this topic via email shortly before the start of the exam registration period. Please find more details at the respective portals for exam registration.

Please note:

Technical constraints make online registration impossible for some compulsory elective modules. If you are unable to register online for the required compulsory elective module, you can register for examinations using the relevant forms available at the Service Point (House 1, Room 150) or online.

Please read the forms carefully and complete them accurately and in full (Matriculation No., Date, do not forget your signature). Incomplete or incorrectly forms will be deemed invalid and cannot be processed.

Withdrawal

How can I withdraw from my exam registration?

- › Online via www.hio.hs-wismar.de – up to 1 day before the examination date
- › Online via www.lsf.hs-wismar.de – up to 1 day before the examination period
- › In writing at the service point – up to 1 day before the examination date

Please note:

For alternative examinations, the deadline for issuing the topic to be worked on, if applicable, is the examination date. Withdrawal at the end of the examination period is not permitted.

Do I have to justify my withdrawal?

Not if the deadlines above are complied with! The examination board decides on the recognition of the reasons.

Will I lose examination attempts?

Free attempt – YES

1nd attempt - NO

2nd attempt - NO

2nd repeat exam without application – NO – please read the examination rules and academic regulations

2nd repeat exam with application – must always be taken the following semester – please read the examination rules and academic regulations

Are there any exceptions?

Yes, if the withdrawal is due to extraordinary circumstances beyond the student's influence. Such circumstances, e.g. illness, shall be proven by means of corresponding evidence, which is to be submitted at the service point. The appropriate form is available online or at the service point.

Important Note on Failure to Sit an Examination Because of Illness

In the event of failure to sit an examination because of illness, it is necessary to present a medical certificate – otherwise the module examination will be regarded as taken and failed. The medical certificate must include the description of the impairment to health (e.g. reference to specific pains) and must further specify the reasons arising to prevent the sitting of the examination (e.g. inability to

concentrate). It is not possible to recognise medical certificates featuring only a reference to the inability to sit an examination. The form for providing evidence of the inability to sit an examination is available on our website or in front of the service point in House 1. The reason for failure to sit an examination must be presented without delay.

5. Re-Enrolment

In accordance with § 21 Section 1 of the State Higher Education Law (LHG), students shall register (re-enrol) for each semester for the purpose of further study and pay the fees and contributions thus due. The actual amount of the semester fee is available at our website at www.hs-wismar.de/rueckmeldung/.

The annual re-enrolment dates are:

Summer semester from 1 December to 31 January of a given year

Winter semester from 1 June to 31 July of a given year

Payment by Bank Transfer

Payment shall assigned to the Wismar University account specified and include the appropriate intended purpose of the transfer.

Note:

Students who do not pay (or not pay in full) the semester fee for re-enrolment, will not be re-enrolled. In accordance with § 17 Section 7 LHG of the Federal State of Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania, the absence of re-enrolment shall result in deregistration.

In addition, your enrolment will not be renewed if your obligations towards the health insurance funds have not been met.

6. Mandatory Internship

Is it always necessary to pass an internship?

The practical study phase in the form of a mandatory internship is part of all bachelor's and diplom's programmes. It complements both the theoretical training and the application-oriented aspect of the programme.

The practical study phase is an assisted training section with predefined educational contents. It is integrated into the degree programme, regulated by Wismar University, and implemented in combination with lectures. This practical phase is usually fulfilled within the framework of a company or another

profession-oriented institution. The extent of the practical phase is described in the examination regulations.

When do I have to do the internship?

Time and duration of the practical study phase are described in the examination regulations.

Is there anything important to notice?

For the time of the practical study phase, students remain enrolled at Wismar University and retain all the rights and obligations of a regular student.

How do I register my internship?

Registration is conducted in the corresponding faculties and areas (NOT at the service point).

It is worth taking a look at the university's Job Portal, where companies also advertise internships.

7. Thesis

The preparation of the degree thesis and the associated colloquium are requirements for finishing the degree programme:

What do I have to do?

Apply for examination admission

- Find corresponding forms online or at the service point
- Collect and prove required number of credits (the Examination and study regulations tell you how many credits you need!)
- Provide thesis topic in German and English (Important for your certificate!)
- Indicate supervisors (1st and 2nd) and collect their approval (signatures)
- Submit application form at the service point (or forward it via mail)

Can I appoint someone from my company as my supervisor?

Yes, of course. You can choose someone from your internship company as your second supervisor. However, that person must have a degree that is at least equivalent to your pursued academic degree.

When and where do I have to submit my thesis?

Your examination admission will be sent to you via mail. It will include the starting date for your academic work as well as the latest submission date. You will have to submit three copies of the thesis at the service point. Please make sure to check the opening hours!

Is it possible to extend the submission deadline?

Yes, you may apply for an extension at the service point at least 2 weeks before the submission date. You are required to state the reason for your application. The final decision lies with the examination board.

When can I defend my thesis?

In general, the defence of your degree thesis is only possible after the submission of all examination performances/credits. The date of your defence is agreed in consultation with the examiners.

8. Master's Programme

What do I have to do if I want to achieve a master's degree?

Master's programmes require an online application as well. After applying online, you have to submit the following documents:

- Application for admission (printed and signed)
 - Your updated CV (signed)
 - A copy of your ID card (if not yet submitted)
 - Any other application documents corresponding to the study program
- by mail within the application deadlines for direct studies

Which requirements do I have to meet?

In order to get a master's programme admission, you have to meet the following requirements:

- A profession-oriented bachelor's degree or diploma from an equal or related study programme completed at a national or international university
- Depending on the degree programme, at least between 180 and 210 credits according to ECTS

For more details, please read the valid studies, examination or admission regulations.

Decisions regarding exceptional cases lie with the responsible examination board.

If the bachelor's degree has not yet been awarded, but the degree is nearly completed, you can apply for temporary enrolment.

Requirements:

- only applies to a master's degree programme with no restricted number of admissions
- all other admission requirements have been fulfilled according to the rules and regulations
- no more than 25 credits left to complete the bachelor's degree or diploma programme
- the thesis must already be registered and have been started

You can temporarily enrol at the beginning of each semester.

Are the deadlines for a master's programme the same as for a bachelor's or diploma programme?

They actually are the same. However, the enrolment regulations for master's programmes prescribe an extended enrolment period in exceptional cases:

- For the winter semester, by 30 October at latest
- For the summer semester, by 30 April at latest

Conditions:

- All required examination performances (modules, internships, registration of degree thesis, etc.) shall be completed by the end of the winter semester on 28 February or by the end of the summer semester on 31 August.
- Only the submission and the defence of the degree thesis for the first academic university degree may fall in this period.

9. Application Deadlines for Direct Studies

The application deadline for the summer semester is 15 January of a given year (online application from 1 December)

Application deadline for the winter semester is 15 July of a given year (online application from 1 May)

Note: The date of postal receipt of the application (including all documents required) by the university is the critical date, not the date of the online application.

10. Deregistration

Deregistration refers to the cancellation of a student's university studies.

There are three types of deregistration:

1. Deregistration at the student's own request
2. Deregistration after passing the final examination
3. Official deregistration (e.g. due to failure to reply or failed final examination attempt or non-attendance at special student counselling)

What do I have to do?

In case of types 1 and 2:

- Print application for deregistration from www.hs-wismar.de/formulare-studium or ask for a copy at the service point
- Fill in application (CAUTION: Do not forget to indicate the date of deregistration!)*
- Collect notations of discharge from the corresponding area and the library
- Submit the filled in application form at the service point
- The deregistration confirmation will then be forwarded to you via mail

In case of point 3:

Take to your heels and get to the service point as fast as you can.

- Deregistration due to failure to reply is automatically conducted on 1 March or 1 September
- Deregistration due to failed final examination attempts is conducted 4 weeks after the notification regarding the failed final examination attempt has been delivered.
- The removal from the register of students due to non-attendance at special student counselling happens at the end of the semester in which the counselling should have taken place

If you would like to be deregistered earlier, e.g. in order to avoid further semester fees, apply for deregistration at your own request!

*) If you do not indicate a deregistration date, the following applies:

Bachelor graduates are deregistered at the end of the semester the last examination was completed. Any further deregistration due to a passed final examination are conducted 1 month after the student has been awarded with the certificate at latest. In general, a retroactive deregistration is not possible.

If you would like to continue your education with a master's degree programme after earning a bachelor's degree or a diploma, you do not have to apply for exmatriculation. The degree programme will be transferred for you. If you have applied for exmatriculation and are re-enrolled at the university, you will not be considered re-registered but re-enrolled. Enrolment is subject to fees.

11. Exceedance of the designated period of study

If the designated period of study is exceeded by more than four semesters, the university issues an invitation to special student counselling according to Sec. 12 para 4 of the Rahmenprüfungsordnung (general examination rules). In this document, time limits for a successful graduation are defined. Technical requirements and the personal situation of the students should be aligned. If a student does not attend special counselling, they will be removed from the register of students. If set time limits of the conception are exceeded, the final paper qualifies as delivered and failed for the first time (Sec. 20 para 7 Rahmenprüfungsordnung).

12. CHANGING DEGREE COURSE

Can I change my degree programme during my studies?

Yes, of course you can. You may apply online during the specified application period. After completing the online application, you will have to submit the following documents:

- study programme admission application or matriculation application form (print and sign)
- a current CV (signed)
- the reasons for changing the degree programme
- a copy of your ID

For further information, please contact the General Student Advice or the service point.

Studying

With the start (and the further course) of your study, you will come into contact with many terms, schedules and regulations. To help you, we have compiled here a few important pieces of information and explanations.

1. Matriculation Number

What is the use of the matriculation number?

Each student receives a matriculation number on their enrolment (matriculation). You must memorise this number, since you will need it for all events connected with the university administration (e.g. for examinations, etc.).

It is recommended that for data protection reasons you do not pass this number on to third-parties.

2. Student ID

Your student ID comes in the form of a chip card. Over the course of the next few years, it will be one of your most important companions.

How do I get one of these?

The chip cards are issued within the first week of lectures of the semester. The exact issuing dates will be announced over the different areas.

What is it good for?

Your student ID allows you to use the university's infrastructure, e.g. our canteen, the library and the copy service. At the same time, it documents your student status. Apart from the authorisation to access certain areas of the university, the chip card also features the semester and culture ticket for students attending maritime studies.

Do I need a new student ID every semester?

No. Just remember to extend the validity of your ID card at the beginning of each semester, once you have re-registered for the following semester. The corresponding validation stations are located in house 1 (Wismar Campus) and house 2, room 2301 A (Warnemünde).

What do I do if I lose my student ID or in case it doesn't work anymore?

If you lose your student ID, please report the loss to the service point and the library immediately so that we can block your ID.

In case of damages, please request a new ID at the service point.

3. Credit points = CP

In a bachelor's or master's programme, academic performances are not only evaluated by means of marks but also in the form of points which are awarded in accordance with the ECTS standard ("European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System").

What is the calculation behind my CPs?

Credit points are based on the amount of work the respective course requires. One credit point is equivalent to 30 hours of academic work.

How do I know how many CPs I can get?

The examination and study regulations tell you how many CPs you will get per module or examination. Every student should collect about 30 credit points per semester.

4. SWS (Weekly semester hours)

These are the teaching periods to be attended each week of the semester. The minimum number and guide values are available in the conditions of study. If you adhere to them, then you can complete your study in the prescribed period of study. A weekly semester hour has a duration of 45 minutes, normally two are calculated per lecture event.

5. Semester Abroad

A semester abroad during the study course is proving useful in an increasing number of study courses and professional fields. In this regard, the two essential possibilities for such a semester abroad are in the form of the study stay and internship abroad.

Wismar University cooperates with over 150 international universities abroad and supports students via participation in exchange or mobility programmes. You can find out more on this subject in the University International Office.

You have the opportunity to study abroad for a semester:

- Study/do an internship in Europe – the Erasmus+ programme supports and funds your studies at various partner universities in Europe
- Study/do an internship outside of Europe – in partnership with other universities, one or two semesters can be completed at a partner university outside of Europe
- Study abroad on your own – if you could not find a suitable partner university, you can also organise your own semester(s) abroad

There are many funding opportunities that will help open up the world to you. Review your options ahead to time.

Erasmus+ / PROMOS / German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) / student financial support (BAföG) for abroad / education loan from the federal government / foundations and other organisations.

Student Residences in Wismar

The “Studierendenwerk Rostock-Wismar” offers in total four student dormitories in Wismar. The housing units are priority are intended as shared flats for 1 to 3 additional roommates from all over the world. The inhabitants are looked after by a residence tutor. In case of repairs, the mobile janitor service will gladly help you out. If you are interested, please visit the website of the student union, click on "Accommodations", and fill in and submit your residence application.

Students can apply for a university place for the winter semester from 1 March of the respective year. The earlier the application is submitted, the better is the chance of getting a dormitory place. Studierendenwerk send out all dormitory place offers starting from the middle of June. If you received an offer, you have a few days to check the offer. An inspection of the facilities is not possible. If you do not reply in the set time, you are removed from the waiting list. You will not receive another offer and the spot on the waiting list is unfortunately lost.

The dormitory rental agreement is signed for one whole year. If you can provide appropriate documents, the agreement can be concluded for one semester. The email with the dormitory place offer includes also

the rental agreement, the general rental terms and conditions and the house rules. If you cannot provide the proof of enrolment at the time of reply, please hand it in later.

The rent is flat rate, which includes all the costs (cold rent, service charges, electricity, furniture, internet). The rooms are furnished, and at some dormitories you can rent a parking spot. All dormitory rooms are equipped with a wired network/LAN-connection. Using a WiFi network ist possible in someone dormitories.

Central User Identification

How can I use the university's IT systems?

A central user ID is required to use the central IT services of the university (e.g. e-mail, Stud.IP, ILIAS and LSF). This will be sent to you by e-mail with your enrollment.

WiFi on the University Campus

How do I use the Wifi on campus?

The campus-wide Wifi can be used by members of the university as well as registered guests. Students use the secure network eduroam as registered users (by means of their central user ID), guests the regulated network HSW-Guest.

E-Mail

Do I get an e-mail account for my studies?

Yes, every student receives a personal e-mail address with the enrollment. You can access your mail box via <https://myoffice.hs-wismar.de/> by using your personal username. Enhanced connection options are described here <https://www.hs-wismar.de/it-info>.

Do I have to use this e-mail account?

Yes, the university e-mail account must be viewed regularly, as it is used by the matriculation and examination office to send important information.

Can't this be done via my private e-mail account?

No, for data protection reasons this is unfortunately not possible.
(A forwarding of e-mails to a private account can be set up.)

Campus Cloud

What can I use CampusCloud for?

To store, edit or exchange files securely, the university offers its own cloud solution called CampusCloud (cf. dropbox). Students can save up to 5 GB each and share it with fellow students. Using the integrated OnlyOffice software (cf. GoogleDocs), the data can also be edited or jointly created online.

The platforms Stud.IP, ILIAS, LSF or HISinOne are used in everyday student life at our university. Access is possible with the central user ID.

Organize and Manage Courses with Stud.IP

What is Stud.IP?

The most important platform in everyday student life serves to organize and design courses. It enables and standardizes online communication between teachers and students at our university. For example, events, dates and changes are announced here, but it also holds scripts, exercises and test exams.

In the lecture halls in Houses 1, 6, 7, 18 and at the Malchow and Warnemünde sites, listening support is offered via your smartphone. MobileConnect stations have gradually been installed here on the network since 2020. This process should be completed at the end of 2024.

A MobileConnect station is the hardware for the Sennheiser WiFi-based system for listening support. The system is optimised for use at universities and is compatible with listening devices if the hearing aid allows it. Via the already existing WiFi access point, the signal is made available for up to 100 smartphones per station, whereby the MobileConnect app serves as the receiver and must be installed. For the applicability, a microphone is required by the lecturers and a smartphone with the MobileConnect app installed as well as access to the WiFi eduroam for the recipients. 4. Compensation for Disadvantages

Students who are unable to meet the defined studying and examination requirements due to a disability, a chronic disease and/or a mental illness may apply for compensation for disadvantages. The purpose of this compensation is to ensure equal opportunities and make up for the increased necessity of time and effort. For example, the student may be entitled to longer examination times, to the usage of a computer for writing assistance, or to oral instead of written examinations. Since compensation for disadvantages are subject to individual assessments, it is advisable to arrange a personal conversation as early as possible.

Compensation for disadvantages is not to be understood as preferential treatment but as a basic right of any disabled student (§ 3, subsection 3, sentence 2 of the German Basic Law, as well as § 38, subsection 4 of the German State University Law). At content level, students with disabilities or chronic diseases must provide the same performances as their fellow students without disabilities.
